MALAYSIA

To know Malaysia is to love Malaysia - a bubbling, bustling melting-pot of races and religions where Malays, Indians, Chinese and many other ethnic groups live together in peace and harmony. Our multiculturalism has made Malaysia a gastronomical paradise and home to hundreds of colorful festivals. It's no wonder that we love celebrating and socializing. As a people, Malaysians are very relaxed, warm and friendly.

Geographically, Malaysia is almost as diverse as its culture. 11 states and 2 federal territories (Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya) form Peninsular Malaysia which is separated by the South China Sea from East Malaysia which includes the 2 states (Sabah and Sarawak on the island of Borneo) and a third federal territory, the island of Labuan.

One of Malaysia's key attractions is its extreme contrasts which further add to this theme of 'diversity'. Towering skyscrapers look down upon wooden houses built on stilts while five-star hotels sit just meters away from ancient reefs. Rugged mountains reach dramatically for the sky while their rainforest-clad slopes sweep down to floodplains teeming with forest life. Cool highland hideaways roll down to warm, sandy beaches and rich, humid mangroves. For the perfect holiday full of surprises, the time is now, the place is Malaysia. In the northern part of Peninsular Malaysia lies Thailand, and in the south, neighbouring Singapore. Sabah and Sarawak are bounded by Indonesia while Sarawak also shares borders with Brunei.



PEOPLE & LANGUAGE

Malays comprise 57% of the population, while the Chinese, Indian and Bumiputeras and other races make up the rest of the country's population. While Malay is the national language the many ethnic groups also converse in their various languages and dialects, but English is also widely spoken. Islam is the official religion of the country, but other religions such as Buddhism and Christianity are widely and freely practiced.

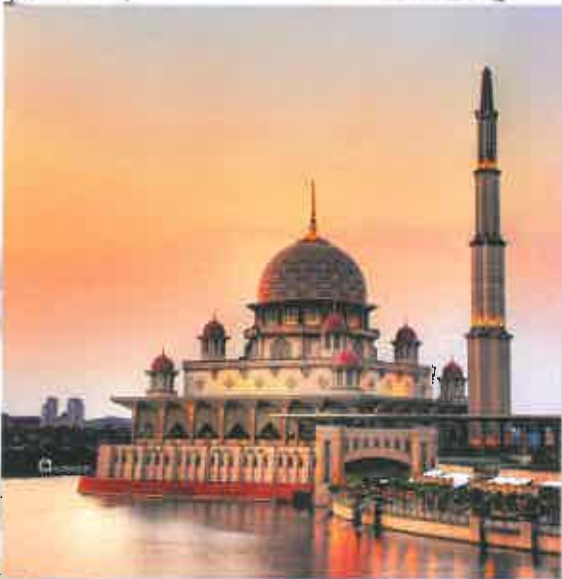
CURRENCY

The monetary unit of the country is Ringgit Malaysia and is written as RM or MYR. The exchange rate is valued at USD1 = RM3.26. Notes are available in RM1, RM5, RM10, RM20, RM50, and RM100 denominations, while coins are issued in 5, 10, 20 and 50 sen (cents) denominations. Foreign currencies can be exchanged at banks and money changers.

WEATHER

The country experiences tropical weather year-round. Temperatures range from 21°C (70°F) to 32°C (90°F). Higher elevations are much colder with temperatures between 15°C (59°F) to 25°C (77°F).

Annual rainfall varies from 2,000mm to 2,500mm. However, the wettest parts of Malaysia could well be the hill slopes of Sarawak's inland areas, which receive a mean annual rainfall exceeding 5,000mm.

GEOGRAPHY - CLIMATE AND WEATHER

Perlis is located at the northern-most of the Peninsular of Malaysia. It is also the smallest state in Malaysia. Perlis experiences tropical monsoon with temperatures ranging from 21°C to 32°C. From the months of January to April, Perlis is usually hot and dry. On the lowlands, the humidity levels are high and it ranges from 82-86% per annum. The wettest period of the year is from May to December where rainfall can be between 2000 to 2500mm a year.

OVERVIEW

SHOPPING GUIDE

The Kayangan Square Mall is one of the more popular places to shop in Perlis. Other than the Kayangan Square Mall, there is also the Padang Besar and the Bukit Kayu Hitam are the areas frequently visited by locals as well as tourists for good buys. There border towns are the targeted place for people who are looking for good bargains. It is at the Padang Besar where you can shop for clothes, household products and well as leather goods. Such products are produced in large numbers in Thailand and then sold here in this part of Perlis. For Bukit Kayu Hitam, it is most popular for being a place to do some duty-free shopping.

DINING / RESTAURANT

In Perlis, the popular restaurants are the Hai Thien Seafood and the Medan Ikan Bakar. These are the places to dine fresh seafood at an affordable price. The Medan Ikan Bakar offers Malay style cooking while Hai Thien Seafood restaurant offers Chinese style of cooking. There are various types of dishes at both these places such as fried squid with sweet chilli sauce, tom yum seafood soup, boiled cockles and many more.



ACTIVITIES

Here are many places of interest in Perlis. Among the more famous one would be Kelam Cave. Gua Kelam is located approximately 26 kilometers from the capital of Perlis. Gua Kelam starts at the limestone hills from Kaki Bukit on the Malaysian border and ends at the Wang Kelian close to the border of Thailand. The Gua Kelam used to be a route used by the locals and the Siamese back in the olden days.

The Snake and Reptile Farm was initially a research facility to test and develop serums for the treatment of dangerous snake bites. Do expect a huge collection of snakes here on display. Also, do not miss the chance to visit the Perlis State Park.

Another place to enjoy great views is the Tasik Melati. This lake is located at a lowland area just approximately 8 kilometers north of Kangar. This is a place to enjoy the breath-taking sights and take time to relax. The Gunung Medan is also a great outdoor destination. This is a 300-feet high limestone hill which can be reached by car or foot.

ACCOMMODATION

Perlis offers various hotels and accommodations such as the Putra Palace Hotel, Hotel Sri Kayangan Inn and even at homestays for those who want to experience the way of life in Perlis.

TRANSPORT

It would be best to move around in Perlis by car but if you do not have a car, you can still opt for taxi or car rental which can come up to quite an amount. Public transport network is not well spread in Perlis, thus it would be wise to have your own car to travel around.



UNIMAP

Universiti Malaysia Perlis (UniMAP) is Malaysia's 17th public institution of higher learning. It was approved by the Malaysian Cabinet on May 2001. Originally known as Kolej Universiti Kejuruteraan Utara Malaysia (KUKUM), or Northern Malaysia University College of Engineering, it was renamed as Universiti Malaysia Perlis (UniMAP) in February 2007. The first intake consisted of 116 engineering students who started classes on June 2002. Currently, UniMAP has approximately 6,000 students and a workforce of more than 1700 academic and non-academic staff members. It offers 21 undergraduate programmes that lead to Bachelor in Engineering, one undergraduate programmes that leads to an Engineering Technology degree and two undergraduate programmes that lead to a Bachelor in Business. We also offers six Diploma in Engineering programmes and 13 postgraduate programmes that lead to Master of Science in Engineering and PhD degrees.

UniMAP graduates are nurtured to become competent practitioners in their area of specialisation and to have the confidence to explore entrepreneurial possibilities



upon graduation. They are expected to not only exhibit excellence in the knowledge and skills that are directly related to their specialised fields of study, but also to demonstrate outstanding proficiency in both communication and ICT skills, as well as possess unsurpassed traits of professionalism and patriotism.

Most of the engineering programmes at UniMAP have an electronic-based focus. However, both basic and applied studies on other fields of engineering and technology that support the advancement of engineering are also actively pursued here. In addition, International Business, Engineering Entrepreneurship and an MBA in Engineering Management are also on offer.

The International Business programme is designed to produce global-business leaders who could function and compete effectively in the globalised market place. The Engineering Entrepreneurship programme aims to equip today's generation of 'technopreneurs' with an excellent entrepreneurial knowledge on managing industrial and technology-based businesses, whilst the MBA in Engineering Management is designed to produce competent managers for the engineering and technology sectors.



WOODBALL

HISTORY OF WOODBALL

Woodball was invented in 1990 by Mr. Ming-Hui Weng, he just wanted to build a garden for his father to take a walk and enjoy the beautiful view in the scenic spot Nei-Shuang-His, where situated in Shih-lin, Taipei City. After mowing the weeds of the hillside, he found that there were terraced fields there, which can be developed as an outdoor exercise place. It flashed through his mind that he could make a good use of this garden by designing it as a ball-playing ground. Under such motive, he was trying to create a ball sport, in which the playing-ball would not fly up (appropriate to be played on the grass ground) and the sport itself should be economic (neither expensive nor large ground), so that he could invite more friends to enjoy the fun of playing ball in the green field. After two years' experiment and adjustment, the equipment and the regulation of the ball game emerged finally as they are today. From that time on, the ball game is officially named Woodball.



The reason that Woodball is popular among the different aged people is not only it has well-designed equipment, which includes ball, mallet and gate, but also it is easy to learn and to play. That is also why Woodball has been adopted as one of the physical education courses in some colleges since after that Woodball begins to introduce and develop to other countries.

THE HISTORY OF WOODBALL IN FISU

Since 2004, woodball is part of the programme of the World University Championships. After a first edition organised by Chinese Taipei, two more editions were held in Thailand and Uganda. With an average of 11 countries represented, the highest number of athletes taking part was recorded in Bangkok in 2006 with 91 players.
